Arrive at Liberty State Park, NJ

Board your **Statue Cruises Ferry** to **Ellis Island** and the **Statue of Liberty**. Enjoy a **universal audio tour** will be included with your ferry ride. On Liberty Island, the 30 minute audio tour explores the history of the Statue of Liberty and its importance as a symbol of freedom and opportunity around the world. On Ellis Island, the 45 minute audio tour immerses visitors in the immigrant experience through narration and first-hand accounts, inviting them to vividly relive the immigrant experiences as if they were the "new arrival."

Disembark at Ellis Island.

Registry Room: The historic Great Hall, once filled with new arrivals waiting to be inspected and registered by Immigration officers, now contains historic benches and reproduction inspector desks. Visitors can re-live the experience of 12 million people processed through this cavernous space.

Treasures from Home: Cherished personal objects, photographs and papers brought from the homeland are on display.

American Family Immigration History Center: Opened on April 17, 2001, this new family history research facility contains the ships' passenger records on the over 22 million people who entered through the Port of New York and Ellis Island from 1892-1924, the peak years of immigrant processing at Ellis Island. Visitors will be able to access 11 fields of digitized information, as well as obtain reproductions of original ship manifests and photos of ships of passage.

American Immigrant Wall of Honor: A popular exhibit at the Ellis Island Immigration Museum is the American Immigrant Wall of Honor. The Wall of Honor is located outdoors, just outside the "Peopling of America" exhibit. The Wall honors America's immigrants regardless of when they immigrated or through which port they entered. The Wall is currently inscribed with over 600,000 names. If you would like to add a name to the Wall of Honor, support the continuing work of the Statue of Liberty Ellis Island Foundation, Inc.

Board Ferry and Visit the **Statue of Liberty**.

The **Statue of Liberty** Between 1892 and 1954, approximately 12 million steerage and third class steamship passengers who entered the United States through the port of New York were legally and medically inspected at Ellis Island. Reopened on September 10, 1990 after a massive restoration, the Main Building on Ellis Island is now a museum dedicated to the history of immigration and the important role this island claimed during the mass migration of humanity in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Today, over 40 percent of America's population can trace their ancestry through Ellis Island.

Day 4, Cont.

Located in New York Harbor, the **Statue of Liberty** was a gift of international friendship from the people of France to the people of the United States and is one of the most universal symbols of political freedom and democracy. The Statue of Liberty was dedicated on October 28, 1886 and was designated a National Monument on October 15, 1924.

Enjoy lunch at your own expense in the food court (cafeteria) at Liberty Island. Board ferry to Battery Park, NY.

Arrive at **Battery Park on Manhattan Island** and meet the **motorcoach**.

Visit the **Intrepid Sea, Air & Space Museum** one of America's leading historic, cultural and educational institutions. Opened in 1982, the Museum has welcomed more than 10 million visitors. The Museum is centered on the aircraft carrier *Intrepid* (CVS-11), one of the most successful ships in US history, and now a national historic landmark and one of the most unique attractions in New York City.

Visit the **National September 11 Memorial Museum,** which serves as the country's principal institution for examining the implications of the events of 9/11, documenting the impact of those events and exploring the continuing significance of September 11, 2001.

Enjoy **lunch on your own** at **Brookfield Place Food Court (230 Vesey St, New York, NY).** Positioned just south of Tribeca along the Hudson River waterfront, this 30,000-square foot French-inspired marketplace features a collection of 14 chef-driven eateries including options like Hudson Eats, Le District and eight signature restaurants including Del Frisco's Grille and Parm.

Tour the top of **One World Observatory.** One World Trade Center is the main building of the rebuilt World Trade Center complex in Lower Manhattan, New York City. It is the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere, and the sixth-tallest in the world.

Drive through the **Financial District**. The Financial District, also known as FiDi, is a neighborhood located at the southern tip of the borough of Manhattan in New York City, which comprises the offices and headquarters of many of the city's major financial institutions, including the New York Stock Exchange and the Federal Reserve Bank of New York.

Visit **Chinatown.** Manhattan's Chinatown is a neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, New York City, bordering the Lower East Side to its east, Little Italy to its north, Civic Center to its south, and Tribeca to its west.

Little Italy. Tenement buildings, once home to the immigrants who settled the area in the late 1800s, line the narrow streets.

Enjoy dinner included this evening at Da Nico, an authentic Italian restaurant **located in New York's Little Italy**. Family owned and operated since it's foundation in 1993, Da Nico offers an Array of Italian dishes using fresh ingredients and a distinct style.

<u>Drive by</u> **Macy's.** Macy's was founded by Rowland Hussey Macy, who between 1843 and 1855 opened four retail dry goods stores, including the original Macy's store in downtown Haverhill, Massachusetts, established in 1851 to serve the mill industry employees of the area.

Madison Square Gardens. Madison Square Garden, often called "MSG" or simply "The Garden", is a multi-purpose indoor arena in the New York City borough of Manhattan.

Empire State Building. The Empire State Building is a 102-story skyscraper located on Fifth Avenue between West 33rd and 34th Streets in Midtown, Manhattan, New York City. It has a roof height of 1,250 feet, and with its antenna included, it stands a total of 1,454 feet tall.
